Dedication Anniversary of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception-Crookston

The anniversary of the Cathedral's dedication is observed as a Solemnity in the Cathedral Church; and as a Feast throughout all the parishes of the diocese.

In the Cathedral only this would begin with *Evening Prayer I "Common of the Dedication of a Church."* This means that **in the Cathedral** a Mass during the morning/day on Saturday (not the Vigil Mass of Sunday, 9/26), the texts and readings, "*For the Anniversary of the Dedication of a Church*" are used, the *Gloria* is prescribed, along with the Creed & proper preface.

Outside the Cathedral, a Mass during the morning/day on Saturday (not the Vigil Mass of Sunday, 9/26), the Mass texts and readings "*For the Anniversary of the Dedication of a Church*" are used, & proper preface. (No *Gloria* or Creed).

Also, a **plenary indulgence** (under the usual conditions) can be gained by visiting the Cathedral on this day and praying the *Our Father* and *Creed*.
